Prosperity Salad of Hiramasa Kingfish, ginger plum dressing

Prosperity toss also known as Yusheng is a Cantonese-style raw fish salad. It usually consists of strips of raw fish mixed with shredded vegetables and a variety of sauces and condiments, among other ingredients. The word for fish, "yu," sounds like the Chinese words for both "wish" and "abundance."

XO Tiger prawn San Choi Bao

The Cantonese word for lettuce sounds like "rising fortune," so it's common to serve lettuce wraps filled with other lucky ingredients.

Crying Tiger Wagyu beef tartare, chilli, lime, crispy preserved mustard greens

Salt baked chicken, sand ginger and spring onion relish

Serving a whole chicken symbolizes wholeness and prosperity.

Cumin spiced lamb springrolls

Spring rolls symbolize wealth because their shape is similar to gold bars.

Rainbow Fraser Island spanner crab xiao long bao

These round dumplings signify family reunion as most families spend New Year's Eve together preparing them before eating them at midnight. They also represent prosperity because their shape resembles ancient Chinese gold ingot

Steamed Dory, preserved salted chilli and soy sauce

The word for fish, "yu," sounds like the Chinese words for both "wish" and "abundance." As a result, it's customary to serve a fish at the end of the New Year's evening meal, symbolizing a wish for abundance in the coming year. For added symbolism, the fish is served whole, with the head and tail attached, representing a good beginning and ending for the months to come.

Wok tossed Chinese broccoli, king brown mushroom, ginger

Duck symbolizes fidelity in Chinese culture, and Peking duck has a long history that can be traced back to the Ming Dynasty's imperial court menu.
